* Sentences of Scripture

My friends hear these words from the first letter of John, the fourth chapter: God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them.

* Statement on the Gift of Marriage

We gather this day in the presence of God, giving thanks for the gift of marriage and to witness the joining together of $\{name\}$ and $\{name\}$. Our purpose is to ask God's blessing on union as $\{name\}$ and $\{name\}$ join one another in covenant union. We ask also for God's strength so they may be empowered to endure the many joys and trials that come with marriage.

God created us male and female, and gave us in marriage so that husband and wife may help and comfort each other, living faithfully together for better or for worse, for richer or poorer, in sickness and in health, as long as they both shall live. Marriage is a gift from God, and is designed for us to express our love for one another, just as God expresses His love for us. In marriage we are called to a new way of life. This new way of living must not be entered into carelessly, or from selfish motives, but responsibly and prayerfully.

We rejoice that marriage is given by God, blessed by our Lord Jesus Christ, and sustained by the Holy Spirit. Therefore, let marriage be held in honor by all.

Let us pray.

Gracious God, you are always faithful in your love for us. Look mercifully upon $\{name\}$ and $\{name\}$, who have come seeking your blessing. Declarations of Intent

Will the congregation please stand?

Our God is a covenant God and calls us into communities of faith.
